Dear Ms. Pelham:

Pursuant to San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code section 3.234(c)(3), I am writing to request a waiver from the ban on receiving compensation from certain City contractors imposed by subsection 3.234(a)(3).

The late-Mayor Ed Lee appointed me to fill a vacancy as District 8 Supervisor on January 6, 2017. This appointment required me to leave my employment at the University of California San Francisco, where I had worked for 17 years. As you know, I was not elected to serve a full term at the June 5, 2018, election. I will therefore step down from the Board on July 10, 2018, but have not yet found new employment. Unfortunately, there are very few openings in my chosen field of employment in any given year, let alone positions that would enable me to provide the income and benefits my family relies upon me to provide. A waiver would enable me to pursue a position with the University of California, my former employer, that is currently open and for which I am qualified. This position would afford me the opportunity to work in my chosen field and continue to accrue benefits as an employee of the University of California.

If I am barred from pursuing this position or others like them that may subsequently open at UC, I will likely lose the opportunity to work in my chosen vocation and will be deprived of the chance to accrue sufficient time as a UC employee (20 years) to fully vest for purposes of health care benefits. This will be an extreme hardship for me, my husband, and my daughter. Counterbalancing this is the fact my limited participation in the three UC-San Francisco contracts that came before the Board during my term did not create the potential for, or appearance of, any undue influence or unfair advantage for UC. Accordingly, I respectfully request that the Commission consider the following facts and approve my request for a waiver:

# I. <u>The UC-City Contracts At Issue</u>

As suggested above, I am seeking this waiver so that I can seek employment with UC in the coming months. During my service on the Board, I participated personally in the award of the following three contracts between UC and the City:

- On October 3, 2017, I sponsored a resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept a \$144,996 grant from the Regents of the University of California, Office of the President, to participate in a program entitled PrEP-T: Advancing PrEP Delivery in the Transgender Community for the period of April 1, 2016, through March 31, 2018. Exs. A & B The resolution was approved by a vote of 11-0. Ex. C.
- (2) On February 27, 2018, I joined a unanimous board in approving an ordinance authorizing the settlement of a lawsuit filed by David Zeller alleging medical malpractice at San Francisco General. The settlement agreement required: the City to pay \$290,000; the UC Regents, a co-defendant in the lawsuit, to pay \$200,245; and upon approval by the probate court and agreement by plaintiff, the California Department of Health Care Services to provide an additional \$65,300. Exs. D & E. The agreement was approved by a vote of 10-0, with one member excused. Ex. F
- (3) On February 27, 2018, I again joined a unanimous board in approving an ordinance authorizing the settlement of the lawsuit filed by Donald Spadini alleging negligence by doctors, nurses and staff. The settlement agreement required the City to pay \$120,600, and the UC Regents, a co-defendant in the lawsuit, to pay \$59,400. Exs. D & G. The agreement was approved by a vote of 10-0, with one member excused. Ex. F.

None of these decisions involved a commitment of City funds and all were made unanimously.

# II. The Prohibition Would Cause Extreme Hardship For Me And My Family

I am the primary breadwinner for my family. My husband is a real estate transaction coordinator and is an independent contractor. As such, he does not receive benefits in connection with his work. We have a teenage daughter. All three of us have relied on my salary as our primary source of income, and relied on the health insurance provided through my employers as our exclusive source of health insurance. Because I have not yet found new employment, my family

and I expect that we will lose a significant share of our income and all of our health insurance and other benefits when I step down from the Board of Supervisors in July.

The loss of health insurance is particularly concerning because I am HIV positive. This fact makes my need for continuous, high-quality health insurance absolutely essential, but it also makes it far more difficult for me to acquire the kind of insurance I need. Many employers, particularly smaller employers, do not offer the kind of coverage I need at a price my family can afford. Coverage through Covered California is an option, but for a family of three which does not qualify for subsidies and requires the coverage provided by Platinum-level plans, the costs would be exceedingly steep. The same would be true of maintaining my current coverage through COBRA. For these reasons, I do not have the luxury of seeking employment from the full range of employers located in the Bay Area. I must instead focus my search on larger employers who offer generous health insurance benefits. Furthermore, because I have 17 years of prior service on behalf of UC, I would be entitled to full health care coverage for me and my spouse if I were able to accrue three additional years of service.<sup>1</sup>

Nor could I seek employment with many of the private-sector employers in the Bay Area without sacrificing my chosen vocation: to advocate for those living with HIV, and to support and advocate for medical research. I have devoted my life to this work, including serving as the former President of the Harvey Milk LGBT Democratic Club; as former Mayor Newsom's advisor on HIV/AIDS; as a victim advocate in the San Francisco District Attorney's office; as a founding member of the Steering Committee of San Francisco's Getting to Zero Consortium, which seeks to help the City eliminate new HIV infections and deaths; as the communications director at the UCSF AIDS Research Institute from 2000 through 2016; and as a member of the Governing Board of the California Institute for Regenerative Medicine, the state's stem cell research agency, since 2004.

I may also be unable to obtain adequate and affordable life and disability insurance coverage if I am unable to work for UC. Having to disclose my HIV status to a private employer or insurance company could make it impossible to obtain affordable life and disability insurance. By contrast, UC waives pre-existing conditions for employees who wish to obtain life and disability insurance.

I am exceedingly reluctant to seek employment outside the Bay Area. My daughter has always attended San Francisco public schools, my husband's real estate clients are here, and we own a

home in Glen Park. It would therefore be extremely disruptive to my entire family if we had to relocate.

To summarize, there are very few job openings in the Bay Area in any given year that provide the insurance and level of income I feel obligated to provide for my family and myself, and which would allow me to continue pursuing my chosen vocation.

There is, however, a current opening with UC that would allow me to do all of these things. The position involves working on issues that involve medical research, including for those living with HIV.<sup>2</sup> In addition, the position would provide robust health, life, and disability insurance for me and my family, as well as a level of income that will ensure I can adequately care for my family.

Importantly, the position would also allow me to continue participating in UC's retirement program. I have already accrued pension benefits while working for UC in the 17 years prior to my service on the Board of Supervisors. If I am able to begin working with UC again, I will be able to continue accruing pension benefits. This is another very important consideration, given that I am currently 61 years old.

Since the election, I have been actively looking for other positions, but the position with UC is the only position I have found that fits the criteria described above.

If I am forced by the prohibition to wait to apply for any position with UC until February 27, 2019, the position will have been filled. It is unclear when another position in my chosen vocation will open at UC, but it could realistically take years. Similarly, it could be years or many months before another position in my chosen vocation opens with any Bay Area employer that would be willing and able to provide the income and benefits my family needs. I am concerned that I could face a prolonged period of unemployment, which would be very challenging from both a financial and professional perspective.

# III. Granting A Waiver Would Not Raise Any Ethical Concerns

I understand that the prohibition on employment with City contractors exists to protect the integrity of governmental decision-making; to ensure that contracts are, and appear to be, awarded on a fair and impartial basis; and to avoid creating unnecessary barriers to public

service. SF C&GCC § 3.200. I support these goals, and firmly believe that my involvement in these contracts did not create the potential for, or appearance of, any undue influence, favoritism, or preferential treatment. The waiver I seek would therefore be fully consistent with the purposes of the prohibition.

To begin with, I had no conflict of interest at the time of my involvement with the three contracts. In October 2017 and February 2018, when the Board considered these contracts, I was devoting my full professional energies to serving my district on the Board of Supervisors and my campaign for election to a full term on June 5, 2018. Accordingly, I was not seeking employment with UC or with any other employer prior to the election, and I did not engage in any negotiations with UC or any other potential employer before June 5, 2018.

I also had no role in negotiating the terms of the three contracts. The resolution relating to the first contract just retroactively allowed the City to accept a grant UC had already awarded to the City's Department of Public Health in 2016 before I joined the Board of Supervisors. *See* Ex. B. In fact, by the time the resolution was approved, most of the authorized grant period had already elapsed (19 of 24 months). Its continuation beyond that was subject to the availability of funds and satisfactory progress of the project. *Id.* at 4. The votes approving the settlement agreements merely gave the Board the choice to approve or disapprove agreements that had already been negotiated by counsel for the parties to the litigation. Neither I nor any other Board member sought to change those previously negotiated terms.

Furthermore, none of the three contracts at issue can reasonably be construed to provide UC with any preferential treatment, in part because none involved the payment of any City funds to UC. To the contrary, the resolution approving the public health grant involved UC giving money to the City. And the votes approving the settlement agreements involved the City and UC separately paying funds to plaintiffs; no money or benefits were exchanged between the City and UC, who were co-defendants in both lawsuits.

Finally, my role in supporting these contracts was immaterial to their ultimate approval. The Board approved each contract unanimously, without debate or dissent. My own vote was simply beside the point.

In short, the facts surrounding my participation in all three contracts readily demonstrate that I did not engage in any unfair or biased conduct towards UC, and that my conduct did not give rise even to the appearance of any impropriety.

# IV. <u>Public Employment Raises Fewer Ethical Concerns Than Private Employment</u>

I understand that San Francisco's ban on receiving compensation from certain City contractors does not distinguish between contractors who are from the public sector, and contractors who are from the private sector. Nevertheless, many state ethics laws do draw such a distinction, demonstrating that public officials who secure subsequent employment in the public sector raise fewer ethical concerns than officials who secure subsequent employment in the private sector.

For example, Government Code section 87407 prohibits a public official from making, participating in making, or attempting to influence any government decision regarding a prospective employer, but the prohibition does not apply if the employer is a state, local, or federal government agency. Cal. Code Regs. tit. 2, § 18747(d)(3).

Government Code section 87406 prohibits state officials from communicating with his former agency to influence an agency action for one year after leaving office, but does not apply if the former official becomes an officer or employee of another state agency or an elected official of a local agency. Gov't Code § 87406(e).

Government Code section 87406.3 prohibits local elected officials from communicating with their former agency to influence an agency action for one year after leaving office, but does not apply if they are appearing on behalf of another public agency. Gov't Code § 87406.3(b).

Government Code section 82030(b)(2) excludes compensation received from a government agency from the definition of "income" for purposes of state ethics laws. Therefore, an official who receives income from a government agency is not considered to have a financial interest in that agency.

Consequently, I believe the fact that I am seeking a waiver in order to secure employment in the public sector should further weigh in favor of granting the waiver.

# V. <u>Prior Similar Waiver Considerations By The Commission</u>

It is my understanding, based on your May 19, 2016 Memorandum analyzing Julie Christensen's request for a waiver from certain post-employment restrictions, that the Commission has previously considered and granted three requests to waive the ban on receiving compensation from certain City contractors. In two of those requests, the former City officials had actively participated in negotiating and awarding City contracts to their prospective employers. In one case, the Commission granted a waiver to allow a former Director of the Mayor's Office of

Housing to work for an organization that signed five contracts with the City in the previous 12 months, including three which the former Director had actively participated in awarding. In the other, the Commission granted a waiver to allow a former City official to work for a nonprofit corporation focused on bringing the America's Cup to the City, after that official had worked for the City for nearly one year in negotiations with that nonprofit and the America's Cup Authority.

My involvement in the three contracts at issue here was significantly less than the involvement of either of these officials, given that I merely voted to approve grants and agreements that had been negotiated by other parties.

# VI. <u>Certification And Conclusion</u>

Pursuant to Ethics Regulation 3.234-4(a)(2), I certify that I have provided a copy of this waiver request to Angela Calvillo, the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

For all of the reasons described above, I respectfully urge the Committee to grant my request for a waiver. I will appear at the Commission's July 20, 2018 meeting, and will be happy to address any questions or concerns that any commissioner may have.


